

## **DECISION No GB/2021/5**

of

## The European Cybersecurity Industrial, Technology and Research Competence Centre Governing Board

#### on types of post and post titles in the European Cybersecurity Industrial, Technology and Research Competence Centre

### THE GOVERNING BOARD,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials ('Staff Regulations') and the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Union ('CEOS') laid down by Council Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 259/68<sup>1</sup>, and in particular Article 5 of the Staff Regulations and Annexe[s] I [and XIII] thereto, and Article 10 of the CEOS.

Having regard to European Parliament and Council Regulation (EU) No 2021/887 of 20 May 2021 establishing the European Cybersecurity Industrial, Technology and Research Competence Centre ('the ECCC'),

Having regard to the agreement of the European Commission pursuant to Article 110(2) of the Staff Regulations C(2018) 8800 of 11 December 2018],

## WHEREAS:

(1) On 12 October 2021, the Commission informed the ECCC that it adopted Decision C(2013)8979 of 16 December 2013 on types of post and post titles.

(2) On 26 September 2014 Communication C(2014) 6543 from Vice-President Šefčovič to the Commission on the guidelines on the implementation of Article 110(2) of the Staff Regulations with regard to the implementing rules applicable in the agencies was adopted, and in particular Point 2.B thereof, where the Commission ex ante agreement is referred to.

(3) Pursuant to Article 110(2) of the Staff Regulations, implementing rules such as those referred to in Recital 1 are to apply by analogy to the ECCC. By way of derogation, an agency may request the Commission's agreement to the non-application of certain implementing rules. The Commission may, instead of accepting or rejecting the request, require the agency to submit for its agreement implementing rules which are different from those adopted by the Commission.

(4) Commission Decision C(2013)8979 is suitable to apply to the ECCC provided that certain adjustments are made to take into account the peculiarities of the ECCC. Those adjustments concern in particular the terminology established in the ECCC to describe functions exercised,

the range of grades of Head of Unit post title of which the lower grade should respect the limitation referred to in Article 53 of the CEOS.

(5) For each of the three function groups (AD, AST and AST/SC), the types of post with the corresponding grade ranges are laid down in Annex I to the Staff Regulations.

(6) It is necessary to establish the equivalence between these types of post and the post titles which are used for the ECCC temporary staff,

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

### Article 1

In accordance with Article 5(4) of the Staff Regulations, the tables establishing the equivalence between the types of post and the post titles used for the ECCC temporary staff, which are contained in the Annex to this Decision, are hereby approved.

#### Article 2

Commission Decision C(2013) 8979 of 16 December 2013 does not apply by analogy to the ECCC.

## Article 3

This Decision shall take effect on the day following that of its adoption.

Director <sup>2</sup>	AD 14 – AD 15	Executive Director
Adviser or equivalent	AD 13 – AD 14	For example: Adviser
Head of Unit or equivalent	AD 9 – AD 14	Head of Unit Head of Task Force
Administrator	AD 5 – AD 12	Head of sector Administrator
Senior Assistant	AST 10 – AST 11	Senior Assistant
Assistant	AST 1 – AST 9	Assistant
Secretary/Clerk	SC 1 – SC 6	Secretary/Clerk
