Support DG CNECT in mapping the main cybersecurity players in the EU, stimulating synergies between them and knowledge sharing between National Coordination Centres (NCCs) and the European Cybersecurity Competence Centre (ECCC)

01

Understand the European cybersecurity competence community and give visibility to the cybersecurity market and main stakeholders by building an “EU Cybersecurity Market Observatory” and by analysing strategic funding and investments for increased EU strategic autonomy and competences

02

Develop, connect and support the collaboration between the European cybersecurity communities building on existing efforts, notably (but not only) from ECSC and the four “pilot projects” as well as the Cybersecurity Atlas.

03

Promote innovation through matchmaking and industrial partnering events, funding opportunities through InfoDays and knowledge sharing through cross-border national and regional events.

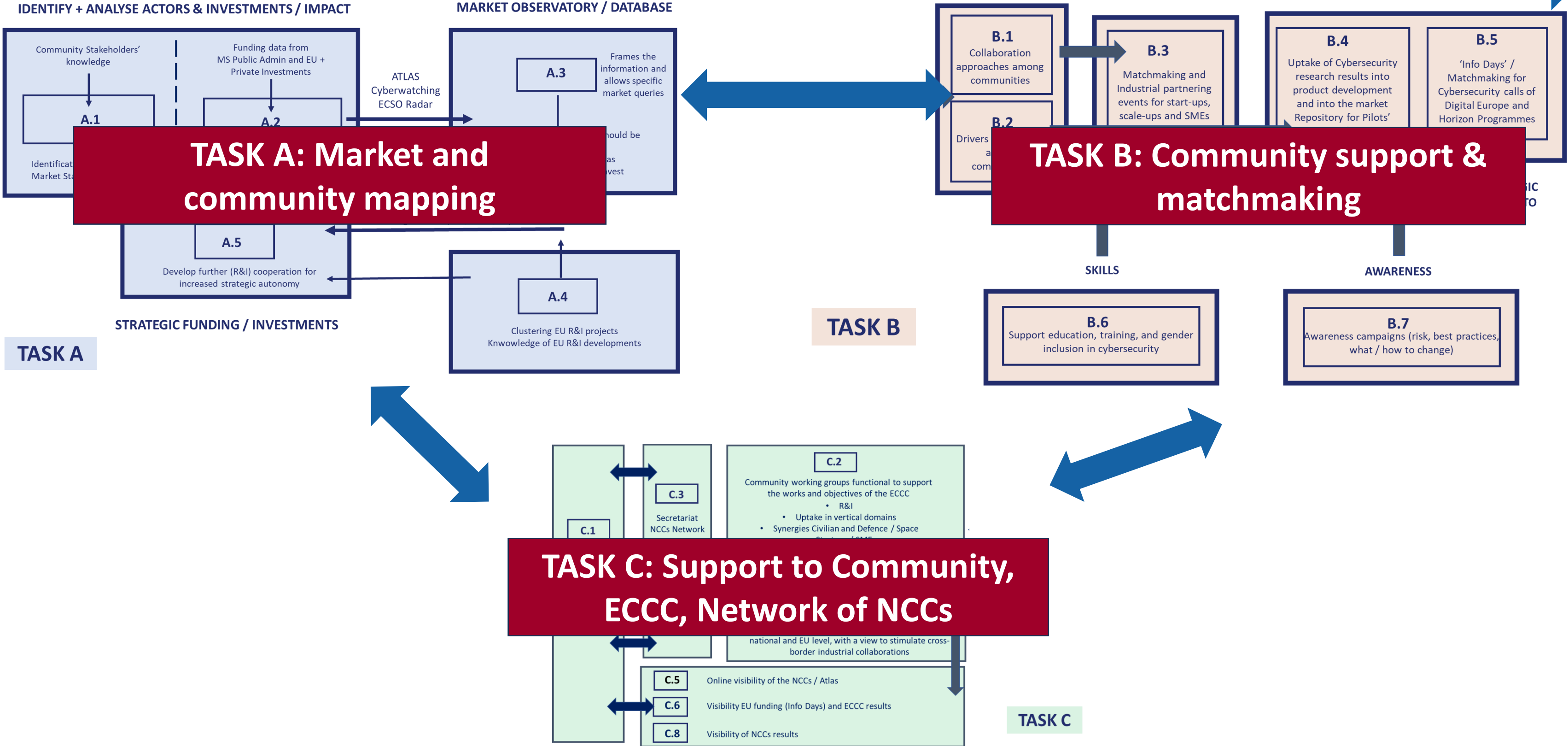

Provide operational support to the ECCC and to the network of NCCs, implementing relevant activities, structures and methodologies, in close coordination with the ECCC and the Commission services

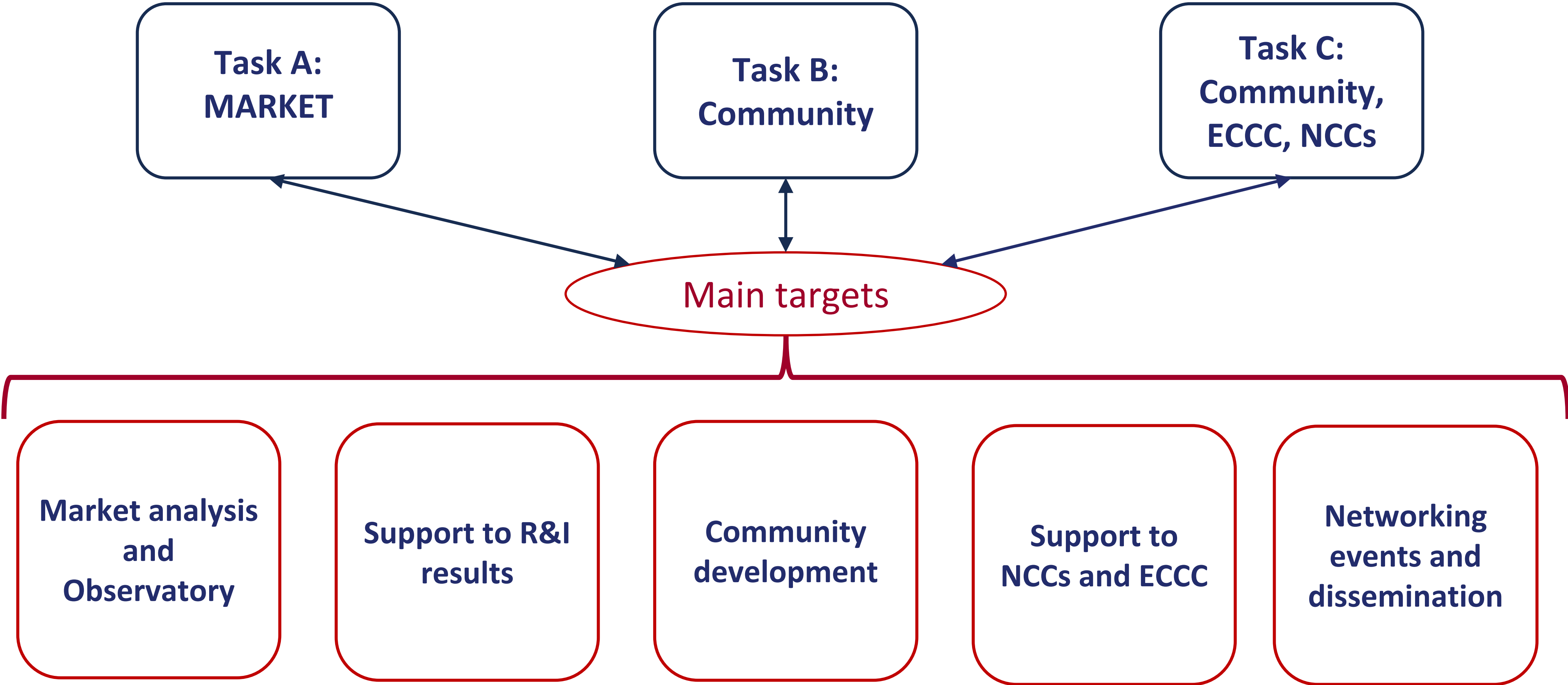

Objective: allow companies to pitch innovative solutions with users (e.g. CISOs) and buyers, and access European cybersecurity market



The very first ECCC A2M event was organised with NCC-PL on the **22nd June in Katowice, Poland** focusing on Identity & Access Management and Risk Management & Risk Assessment

A second ECCC A2M event was organised with NCC-FR on the **21st November in Rennes, France** - focus on “Critical Infrastructure” with 11 EU cybersecurity providers

ECCC Knowledge sharing events



Objective: provide a deeper understanding of critical cybersecurity topics for Europe

Promote inclusivity bringing together key stakeholders, including EU institutions, agencies, National Coordination Centres (NCCs), public authorities, and industry leaders

Provide a platform for actors to convene and exchange competences to address a wide range of relevant cybersecurity challenges for Europe

Focus on the challenges are set by the ECCC Strategic Agenda

In cooperation with NCC-BE - 8th November in Brussels, Belgium - focused on **cybersecurity awareness**

In cooperation with the Women4Cyber (W4C) Foundation - 12th December, online – on **gender diversity and inclusivity in the cybersecurity industry**



- 1) Road-mapping (for the Strategic agenda) “encompassing the whole cybersecurity value chain”
- 2) Startups/Scaleups - SMEs support (as users and providers)
- 3) Trusted supply chains and link to CISOs and SOCs
- 4) Human factors and human rights for users
